SONGS TO SUPPORT DEVELOPMENT

Songs, stories and rhymes are a great way to support your child's development. Throughout history and across cultures, caregivers have used music to interact with their children.

Songs support your child's development in many ways. For example, singing a lullaby while rocking a baby stimulates early language development, promotes attachment, and supports an infant's growing spatial awareness as the child experiences their body moving in space. What is great is that singing requires no special equipment or training.

For your child, your voice is the safest and most familiar sound, and is far better than any recorded music (even if you are off key - children love the sound of their parents voice!)

Sing songs from your language/culture. You can even make up your own songs.

CLAP, CLAP, CLAP YOUR HANDS

TUNE OF "ROW, ROW, ROW YOUR BOAT"

Clap, Clap, Clap your hands, Clap them just like me! Clap them high, clap them low, Clap so joyfully!

Wave, Wave, Wave your hands, Wave them up and down! Wave them fast, wave them slow, Wave them all around!

Stomp, Stomp, Stomp your feet, Stomp them on the ground, Stomp them fast, stomp them slow, Make a happy sound!
